

Pete Ondeng is the Founder and Executive Director of the East Africa Leadership Center (EALC). He is a business strategist, trainer and motivational speaker with over 25 years of international leadership experience in business, government and the non profit sector. Pete is the author of two highly acclaimed books, *Starting a Small Successful Business* and *Africa's Moment*. He qualified as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) in 1984 in the U.S. where he began his career as an internal auditor for a Fortune 500 company. Since returning to Africa in 1986, he has served in a variety of leadership positions in over 20 countries. He is passionate about business and leadership development in Africa and is well known for his inspirational talks at international forums including the annual Africa Business Conference at Harvard University, the World Economic Forum, the Tallberg Forum in Sweden, the Houghton College Lecture Series (NY), the Global Washington Forum (Seattle) and the Global Development Institute at the University of Fraser Valley in Vancouver, Canada.



Michael McCausland is a co-Founder and Executive Director of Humanitarian International Services Group (HISG), a New York state non-profit corporation that specializes in private sector resource mobilization and management. HISG provides support services to US and international organizations for crisis response and humanitarian developmental initiatives. HISG has worked in more than 80 countries and has moved over \$40 million worth of humanitarian aid since 2001. Mike is a dynamic speaker with a wealth of knowledge on global affairs. He was licensed by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to operate and manage commercial nuclear power plants and, for several years, worked with and provided technical and management support services to over 50% of the operating nuclear power plants in the United States. He specializes in large-scale culture transformation, strategy development, business planning, and organizational structure and process.



Rajadurai Jeyapaul is an Indian born MBA from the Indian Institute of Management. He is a highly experienced in corporate affairs, having held positions as Corporate-in-Charge for four major companies and Personal Advisor to the Chairman of the biggest corporate-body in Kenya. He was CEO of two airline systems and Deputy Director of a major seaport in India, where he is credited for turning the port around from an annual loss of US\$ 20 million to an annual profit of US\$ 15 million in 2 ½ years by changing the organizational and operational structures and installing a strong sense of purpose. Jeyapaul has restructured organisations of different scales and grades for viability and growth and is familiar with mathematical and statistical techniques, and the culture, issues and challenges of Africa.



Eric Wafukho is a leadership coach and has served in volunteers organisations both in Africa in the Carribbean where he served in Jamaica. He is founder of Africa Leadership Ministry , an organisation committed to developing leadership resources for strategic leadership in Africa. He has served with organisations like World Vision and World Relief where he served as Country Director for Kenya. He has also served as a radio host , producing and presenting a leadership program called catalyst on Hope Fm. Eric has training in Mathematics from the University of Nairobi and currently pursuing post-graduate studies in Leadership at the Africa Leadership and Management Academy in Harare. is widely travelled on all the five continents. He sits on various Boards including serving as a Council Member on the Governing Council of the NIST/International Leadership University.
